The **Internal Assessments (IAs)** and **Mid-Term Examinations (MTE)** serve as important mechanisms for self-evaluation, enabling you to identify areas for improvement ahead of the **Semester-End Examinations (SEE)**.

You are reminded that internal and semester-end examinations carry **equal weightage** in determining your overall academic performance. The University firmly believes that every student deserves a fair chance to demonstrate and strengthen their academic capabilities.

However, please note that there is **no relaxation in the attendance requirement for the Semester-End Examinations (SEE)**. Students must maintain a **minimum of 75% attendance** to be eligible to appear for the SEE.

All students are also strongly advised to uphold the **highest standards of integrity, honesty, and discipline** during the examinations. Any form of **unethical practice or misconduct** will not be tolerated under any circumstances.

You are further advised to thoroughly go through the **University's Examination Rules and Unfair Means (UFM) Guidelines** and adhere to all instructions issued from time to time. **Failure to read or misinterpretation of these rules will not be accepted as an excuse for any violation.**

Your academic growth and personal development remain of paramount importance to the University. Approach your examinations with **sincerity, confidence, and commitment**, and let your performance reflect your hard work and integrity.
